In Room 12 we have been using 'Big Books' in Maths. The last few weeks we have been reading a book called **Maths and Me**. We have learnt about counting, categories, making questions, collecting data and displaying these on graphs. Last week Room 12 students formed the question "Where do you like to play at school?" and went into junior classes to collect some data with three options 'field, playground or courts'. The following day the students used their collected data to make a pictograph showing the most popular areas in our school to play. The learning conversations about what



they discovered were really interesting. "Not many people like to play on the courts", "Lots of

people like to play on the field", "This graph has seven and seven, they are the same". It was great to hear the maths language as the students worked together in their groups.
